This should be a lot of fun.

If you missed our November demo you really missed a good one. Our own Doug McCulloch discussed elements of design and pointed out attributes that makes one piece work versus another that is less than pleasing. He brought in pieces and photos of his own work sharing with us the evolution of his work over the past decade. He captivated everyone's attention as he critiqued his own work. Doug's is a very talented artist and his work is on display at the Signature Gallery in Savannah's City Market. We only had time for about half of Doug's demo so he has agreed to come back in the spring to turn some (hopefully) pleasing pieces.

Frank Anson will be our Thursday, January 30th demonstrator. Frank is a member of the AAW and an active member of the AAW's Segmented Turning special interest group. Frank's work is on display at multiple galleries in South Carolina. In January Frank will be sharing with us tips and techniques in making smaller gift type items he learned while recently attending a class at the John C. Campbell Folk School taught by Bob Baucom. Students in Baucom's class turned about a dozen different ornaments. Frank will be turning a small segmented lantern that he says anyone can turn plus he will demonstrate hollowing with a skew. This will be a a very informational and entertaining demo that you will not want to miss.

This newsletter is a bit abbreviated. Please remember that all of our demos are free and open to the public. We do encourage our attendees to join the Lowcountry Turners (LCT). Membership is only \$35 per year and all proceeds are used to bring in demonstrators and to maintain our equipment. LCT membership officially runs January through December so dues are due now.
