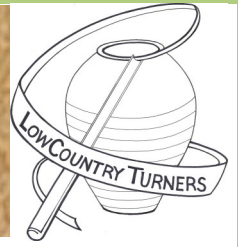

Message From The Board

LCT Members & Friends,

We hope you are having a safe and enjoyable summer. Your LCT board has been busy, but not too busy. We have been on summer vacation, too.

Upcoming events in chronological order:

Our next demo will be Friday, July 20th, 6:00 p.m. at Savannah Technical College's White Bluff Road Campus. Noel Wright will be our demonstrator. Noel is a founding member of the Lowcountry Turners, served as president for many years and is a very talented turner. He has spent many thousands of hours at the lathe meticulously focusing on correct geometry, form and technique which he will share with us as he plans to demonstrate the correct use and the correct sharpening techniques for our woodturning tools. This will be a great event for woodturners of every skill level.

At our July 20th demo we plan to have a wood raffle. Please bring in a blank or two to help the LCT raise some funds. We will also auction off Nick Cook's demo pieces from his April 2017 demo.

Our August demo will be 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 23, at the Georgia State Railroad Museum (the Railroad Roundhouse across the street from the visitor center). Fran DiTommaso will be

our August demonstrator.

Saturday, September 1st, we have been invited to participate in the Georgia State Railroad Museum's "Crafts & Crafters" event. If we can get volunteers, we can set up several lathes, make tops, pens, and whatever else we want AND we can sell our wares. They would like us to be inside in the air-conditioned area under the Museum's offices for 2 hours, but we can also set up our lathes for the entire day in the large blacksmith's shop. Our September demo will be 6:00 p.m. on Friday, September 28th, at Savannah Tech. The demonstrator will be Ed Malesky. We have been asked to conduct some type of woodturning class on the following Saturday & Sunday. The LCT and the instructors will be compensated for this class.

Our October demo will be 6:00 p.m. on Friday, October 19th, at Savannah Tech. Atlanta area turner, Mark Sillay, will be our guest demonstrator. www.marksillay.com Mark will stay an extra day and will be conducting a hands-on-workshop on Saturday the 20th. The cost for Mark's workshop will be \$125 which will include materials.

Mark is an amazingly talented turner and a highly sought after demonstrator. The subject of the workshop on Saturday is TBD. We will ask the members for ideas at the July meeting.

Sunday, October 21st, the LCT will probably be teaching a class at Savannah Tech. The subject is TBD.

Our November demo will be 6:00 p.m. on Friday, November 9th. We do not yet have a demonstrator but the subject for the demo will be crafts and gifts for the upcoming Christmas and Hanukkah season. There will be woodturning classes on the following Saturday & Sunday but the LCT may, or may not be teaching these classes. If the LCT teaches the class, the LCT and the instructors will be compensated. If the LCT does not teach the class, the LCT will receive some compensation for the use of our lathes.

December's meeting will be a holiday social get together (possibly with a short demo) on Friday, December 7th at Savannah Tech. Dinner and non-alcoholic drinks will be served. A \$5 donation is requested.

Saturday, December 8th – 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. – "Savannah Santa Train" at the Georgia State Railroad Museum. Terry Koller, Director of Outreach and Partnership Development has given us center stage for this event and has moved us up into the Roundhouse. The Museum expects upwards of 1,400 visitors to the site on this Saturday. We need volunteers to turn. Unfortunately, we cannot sell anything but we will have significant visibility and publicity during this event.

Membership: Attendance at our demos is decent but our membership is waning. As long as we are using borrowed facilities, we need to keep our demos free and open to the public. We welcome any suggestions. We are very appreciative of Benjamin Curran and the staff at Savannah Tech in allowing us to use their facilities. Unfortunately, Friday is the only day of the week the facility is available to the LCT.
