Message From The Board

LCT Members & Friends,

We will be conducting a live woodturning demo on Thursday, March 25, 2021 from 6:00 p.m. till 8:00 p.m.. Roy Yarger is our demonstrator. The demo will be held at our shop at the Georgia State Railroad Museum, 655 Louisville Road, Savannah. All attendees are required to wear masks and maintain a safe social distance from other attendees.

Rov's demo will focus on the fundamentals of spindle turning including lathe set-up, wood selection, spindle turning tool types, appropriate grinds for those tools, basic cuts, etc. - essentially, the ABC's of spindle turning. Roy will finish with a simple spindle turning project. Roy is one of our more experienced and accomplished members. Upon retirement from IBM in 1994 Roy seriously pursued his interest in woodturning. He has studied at Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts, is a member of, and has served on the board of numerous regional woodturning organizations. He is an active member of the American Association of Woodturners and often volunteers at the AAW's national symposiums. Roy's signature piece, Disc-Vase, garnered national attention when it was the front cover feature story for an issue of Woodturning Design magazine.
