Exciting News—We will have an in person demo in November and NICK AGAR will be our demonstrator. Saturday, November 21, 2020 from 10:30 a.m. till 12:30. This live demo will be conducted in the Blacksmith Shop on the property of the very historic Georgia State Railroad Museum, 655 Louisville Road, Savannah, GA.

An entrance fee to the Museum property is required if you are not a member of the Coastal Heritage Society. The entrance fee for non-members is \$11. Our next several demos will be conducted on Saturdays so please consider purchasing an annual membership for only \$45.

About the Blacksmith Shop - this partially enclosed building is approximately 150 feet by 60 feet with open cupolas in the ceiling roughly 40 feet up. We will easily be able to comply with and exceed all recommended COVID-19 safety protocols. Face masks are required. We suggest you bring your own personal container of hand sanitizer.

Nick Agar is one of the most sought after woodturning demonstrators in the world. Originally from Devon, England, Nick now resides in the US. His work can be found in museums and collections throughout the world. In addition to being a master at turning, carving and embellishing, he has a captivating wit and sense of humor that rivets his audience's attention. the Savannah




Tree Foundation. Zoe Rinker, director of the Foundation will use the ornaments as gifts for their annual fund donors. Roy's ornaments
