Message From The Board

LCT Members & Friends,

Your LCT board has been very, very busy. On Friday, August 31st board members did a "walk-through" of our new, and permanent home. More about this when you get to the December demo.

Many thanks to Fran DiTommaso for another terrific demonstration at our August 23rd meeting held at the historic Georgia State Railroad Museum. Fran shared with us "5 Cuts" using his 5/8" "Sicilian Grind" bowl gouge. His Sicilian Grind is a swept back fingernail grind similar to the David Ellsworth gouges. The 5 cuts included using the bowl gouge for roughing out the blank, slicing cuts, scraping cuts, shear scraping and bevel supported finishing cuts. Fran had dinner reservations so he left as soon as he completed his demo. However, a lively discussion of his demo and the use of his bowl gouge continued for quite some time afterwards. The discussions centered around tool selection and alternate ways to achieve the same end result.

Let us skip "tool selection" and move on to important stuff like "What is the preferred method to shim up your lathe when the floor is not level?" Fran had the perfect remedy. He placed his autographed copy of "Ellsworth on Woodturning; How a Master Creates Bowls, Pots, and Vessels"

(2008) under one leg of the lathe. This, too, generated a lively discussion. Fran lost on this one. No one else in the room would have placed an autographed copy of Ellsworth's book on the floor.

September's demo: 6:00 p.m., Friday, September 28th at the White Bluff Road Campus of Savannah Technical College (5717 White Bluff Road). Jacksonville woodturner, Ed Malesky will be our featured demonstrator. Ed was recently commissioned to create laser engraved platters for Jacksonville's 2018 LISC Community Development Awards. Ed is an accomplished woodturner, woodworker and artist and will turn one of the platters as part of his demo. Ed is the past president of the Northeast Florida Chapter of the AAW, is the current president of the Art Center Cooperative in Jacksonville, is the chairman of the group that puts together the Florida Woodturning Symposium at the Lake Yale Baptist Center each February and is very involved in promoting the arts throughout the State of Florida. This is one of 3 upcoming demos you do not want to miss.

October's demo: 6:00 p.m. Friday, October 19th at Savannah Technical College. Mark Sillay is our demonstrator. Mark is a highly skilled woodturning demonstrator and has created several on-line videos. Mark is in high demand and we are very lucky he has included us on his

demo schedule. This will be another LCT demo you do not want to miss.

Hands-on Workshop: Mark Sillay has agreed to stay over through Saturday, October 20th to conduct a hands-on workshop. If you want to attend this workshop, the cost is \$125 including materials. Please bring a check to the September meeting. Mark can teach just about anything and he will also share with us is how to get that perfect finishing cut. Mark has a unique grind on his tools and they are razor sharp.

November's demo: Savannah Tech is bringing in Steve Ainsworth for a metal spinning demo on Friday, November 9th. Ainsworth will also be conducting a two-day metal spinning class on Saturday & Sunday, November 10 & 11. This class is being offered through Savannah Tech.

December's demo: This is the BIG one. Noel Wright will be our December demonstrator. The date is to be determined but will either be THURSDAY December 6th or THURSDAY December 13th. What is special about this demo? In addition to Noel being our demonstrator, we will be in our NEW HOME. Terry Koller and the staff at the Coastal Heritage Society's Georgia State Railroad Museum have given the Lowcountry Turners one of their buildings. Before we get into this, we must recognize and thank our partners during the past few years for allowing us to use their facilities. After we left SCAD's Forge Building, Ty Donaldson with Maven Makers shared his space. Chace Holloway, owner of Case Woodworking Supply stepped forward and allowed us to use his warehouse for meeting space then Benjamin Curran and the staff at Savannah Technical College graciously allowed us to use their Historic Preservation Lab facilities. Thank you Ty Donaldson, Chace Holloway and Benjamin Curran.

Our new home is on the site of the Coastal Heritage Society's (CHS) Historic Georgia State Railroad Museum property. The approximately 18 feet by 60 plus feet brick building is appended to the Round House and is the closest building to the gravel parking lot and the closest building to the restrooms. We will not be sharing this space with anyone else which means we can set up all of our equipment and leave everything set-up. We can conduct de-

mos, classes and workshops. Ronnie Burgstiner, Roy Yarger, Lonnie Bott, Dan Lee and Gary Fleenor have all given the building two-thumbs-up. We can get into the building in October which will give us a few weeks to prepare for that first demo in December. Ronnie Burgstiner and Gary Fleenor will lead the clean-up & renovation effort.

We do have some rules to follow with our new home. All of our demos must be free and open to the public. Any class or workshop that we conduct must be sponsored by the Lowcountry Turners so that our liability insurance extends to the CHS. Any class or workshop fees must include an additional amount for a day-pass-admission for workshop attendees to come on to the property. (There is no requirement for an admission fee for our Thursday evening demos.) If you are an LCT member and wish to use any of the LCT equipment at any time other than the demo night, you are encouraged to purchase an annual membership to the CHS. It is only \$45. Some of us are already members.

Call for volunteers:

- We need some volunteers to make "Harry Potter Wands" for the Saturday, October 14th "Frogwarts" event at the Georgia State Railroad Museum. We need to make about 100 wands prior to event, then Dan Lee & Lonnie Bott will turn wands on-site that Saturday. If you want to come turn, please do. With respect to the wands, use your imagination. Dan Lee has made 20 and will make another 20. Each being about 12" long. Perfect skew practice.
- Ariana Berksteiner, executive director of the Emmaus House spoke at our August demo. She is looking for donations of some bowls for the Emmaus House Empty Bowl event scheduled for Sunday, November 4th, noon to 2:00 p.m. The Emmaus Soup Kitchen is located at 18 Abercorn Street, Savannah. We only need 5 or 6 bowls which will be sold for \$20 each. We don't need anything elaborate but anything simple would be appreciated. Signed or unsigned – does not matter.
- Roy Yarger has volunteered again this year to lead the "Freedom Pen Project". The exact date has not been set but LCT members will be turning pens on a Saturday morning in November at Case Woodworking Supply.
- We are going to postpone any woodturning demos inside the Savannah Chatham Coun-
















