Message From The Board

LCT Members & Friends,

Stuart Batty is coming in September to the Lowcountry Turners!

September's demo will be 6:00 p.m. MONDAY, September 23rd at the Georgia State Railroad Museum, 655 Louisville Road, Savannah. Our demonstrator is internationally renowned woodturning artist and instructor, Stuart Batty. Originally from England, Stuart now resides in Boulder, Colorado. Stuart has taught classes and conducted many hundreds of demonstrations all over the world. His art is sold in galleries in the US and England. His work can be found in permanent collections including the White House. Stuart has developed a program called the "7 Fundamentals of Woodturning" which he will be sharing with us Monday evening. As always, LCT demos are free and open to the public. We expect a large turnout so come early.

Monday's demo will be followed by a Stuart Batty hands-on-workshop on Tuesday, the 24th 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 with a break for lunch. We had an overwhelming response for the workshop and it filled up within hours of being announced. All of the workshop attendees should bring in their own woodturning gouges/chisels. The LCT does have 7 sets of tools which will be available if needed. Bowl and spindle

blanks will be provided to workshop attendees. If you have a current project you would like some help with, bring it in and let Stuart provide some guidance.

Format of Monday's demo

There will be no raffle. The instant gallery will be limited to 1 piece including your submission for the "small box with loose fitting lid" challenge project. In an attempt to conserve time, we want to stand and describe our instant gallery piece from our chair. Stuart Batty will select the winner of the challenge project submissions. We will have a few reserved seats up front including one for our LCT founder, our photographer, a couple of special guests and hearing impaired members.

We thank Roy Yarger for his July pepper mill demo. Roy has won several awards for his pepper mill designs. They have been featured in woodturning magazines and we expect he will be a winner again this year with his current submission at the Georgia National Fair. Thank you, Roy, for another great demo.

The Railroad Museum was closed during the month of August. No meeting.

As of yet, we do not have a demonstrator for October. October's demonstration will be Thursday, October 24th (week before Halloween).

Doug McCulloch will be our November demonstrator. He will be discussing getting the best out of your wood, improving your woodturned forms, including design / shapes hints and tips, good and bad examples of form / design, and he will turn something (hopefully with a pleasing form) the members request. November's demo will be Thursday, Nov. 21st (week before Thanksgiving).

Community Outreach:

Our agreement with the Coastal Heritage Society includes participating in their October "Frogwarts" and December "Savannah Santa Train" events. An estimated 1,300 visitors will attend "Frogwarts" on Sunday, October 13 between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.. Volunteers should expect to be on site around 9:30 for set up and 4:00 p.m. for clean up. Lunch will be provided. We will be turning Harry Potter wands. Current volunteers include: Gary Fleenor, David Anliker, Lonnie Bott, Roy Yarger and Dan Lee. SCAD students will also be assigned to help the LCT.

Roy Yarger is working with staff at the Savannah Culture Affairs Center to see if the LCT can have a gallery showing sometime in 2020. We should have more news about this at the October demo.

Bringing in Stuart Batty is a major event for the Lowcountry Turners. We thank David Anliker, Gary Fleenor, Roy Yarger and Dan Lee for their work at the shop on Saturday the 7th preparing for the event. The LCT currently has 6 lathes and we are purchasing two more. Dick Glover and Fred Langley have agreed to sell their Delta Midi Lathes to the LCT at a price that is substantially less than their fair market value. We thank both Dick and Fred for their generosity and their continued support of the Lowcountry Turners.

Safety:

There are lots of ways to get get hurt in our shops. We have had a couple of incidents in the past few months that should be noted. Check your woodturing blanks carefully for defects. When a spinning blank breaks apart it can send sharp-edged shrapnel all over the shop including back at you. When you are using your grinder be mindful that the rotating edge of the stone can very sharp. This also includes the Tormek which only turns at 90 RPM's and the the edges of the belts on the Sorby sharpening system. Please be careful.

Membership in the LCT:

Our monthly demos are free and open to the public. We do, however, encourage attendees to join the Lowcountry Turners. Dues are only \$35 and 100% of dues are spent on equipment or demonstrators.
